Message from the President

Sawtell fielded a team of 70 plus competitors across all age groups - Nippers, Seniors/Opens and Masters - both in the water and on the beach. The event was hosted for the second year running by Cudgen/Kingscliff Surf Lifesaving club who did an outstanding job - not only were they super organised and nailed most things on the logistics front, they were also extremely welcoming and hospitable. Once again Sawtell put in a great performance and managed to hold our fifth place record which is a great effort against the other high scoring clubs who had teams double the size of Sawtell. Conditions were once again challenging and all our competitors, in particular our nippers, put in gutsy efforts to get around their respective courses, with some spectacular race viewing in some of the craft events. It was very exciting to see our Junior March Past team take the gold medal and I was proud to be part of our wonderful club. Country has been a great hit out and preparation for those competitors who are attending State and National Titles in the coming months.

It was also great to see so many Sawtell caps on the beach at the recent Branch Championships held at Coffs Surf Club. I particularly want to congratulate Breah Fisher and Jensen O'Leary who represented Sawtell so well as Junior Lifesavers of the Year.

Meanwhile back at the Club, we are now settling into our new routines and systems having moved into the new patrol room. There are still a number of tasks that need to be completed and before long we will be calling on members to assist at a working bee to complete some of the landscaping and external works. We are also continuing to submit applications for grants to attract funding to complete further repairs and renovations to the clubhouse.

I also want to take the opportunity to congratulate one of our younger members - Zac Tominelli who recently gained his CPR certificate. Zac is slowly building his repertoire of SLS skills with the wonderful assistance of Neil Robertson and I know is making a big contribution to the patrol he is part of. Message from Club Captain

Can you believe it but the current patrol season is about 75% of the way through with each patrol only having 3 more patrols to do before the season finishes on Sunday 26 April? It seems like only a short while ago that we were getting ready for the first patrol of the season. I'm pleased with the way that the big influx of new Bronze members following the last course led by Kel Pearce have settled into their patrols. This group of 14 new patrol members has really made a difference to the strength of some patrols. I also look forward to welcoming the current bronze group when they complete their bronzes.

The Bronze medallion is just the start of the qualification pathway for fully functioning patrols with each patrol also required to have the Silver Medallion Beach Management (held by the patrol captain and at least one or 2 other patrol members) IRB Driver and Crew and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques. Most of these courses will be run after the patrol season finishes with the IRB Crewperson course commencing in early May. I would encourage all new members and current IRB crewpeople to undertake the IRB courses this winter and for experienced patrol members to undertake the Silver Medallion Beach Management when it is run by branch.

Apart from patrols and the forthcoming carnivals we have 2 other significant commitments before the season ends. The first of this is the annual bronze program for The Armidale School (TAS). This year 25 TAS year 11 students will undertake their Bronze with us with the first 2 days being **Thursday and Friday 12 and 13 March**. As has been

the case in previous years we will need as many water safety people as possible on the mornings of those days. Depending on the surf conditions one or both of those mornings may be at the Jetty. If they are at Sawtell an IRB will be required.

The second commitment is much bigger and significant. On **Sunday April 5** Sawtell will be the lead organizer and manager of the **Coffs Ocean Swims 2020** under the leadership of Race Director Kerry Bayliss from our club. We will have a very significant commitment for set up and pack up, water safety, first aid and a myriad of other duties on the day. It will be absolutely essential that we have the assistance of as many people as possible to help on the day including to undertake the patrol at Sawtell Beach so that Scott, I and others can assist with the Ocean Swims.

Sawtell Surf Club Competitors Excel in Tough Sydney Competition

This season has seen two of our U15 competitors increase their competition attendance achieving excellent results.

After five weeks of intensive mid-season training, two of Sawtell's U15 competitors travelled to compete at the Manly and Freshwater Carnivals over the Australia Day long weekend. Rhys Mulholland and Maggie McConnachie made their trip worthwhile with excellent results from both competitors over the two days of racing. These two carnivals are attended by top ranked competitors from around Australia and are regarded as a good indicator of form going into the State and Australian championships.

The Manly carnival saw both competitors enter all three individual events – swim, board and iron. With an unpredictable swell and anyone's guess as to which alley was best, they raced with skill and determination, both paddling first in their board heats. Finals saw Rhys make the podium finishing third, and Maggie also standing up for Sawtell with a second. Swim events had the Sawtell crew finishing 4th for Maggie and 8th for Rhys.

The iron events are always inspirational to watch! The order for Manly was swim then board with a decent swell but little help for an easy ride back to the beach. Rhys completed the swim leg in a very respectable 7th place, then put in a strong board leg to finish the race in 9th. Maggie's race saw her come in in third place from



the swim, gaining a place in the transition, and then paddling a perfect board leg to win comfortably.

Both competitors, still on a high from their excellent individual achievements, then teamed up with other clubs to race in composite teams for the board relays and Cameron events. The day finished with their coach brandishing a grin you couldn't remove, and both competitors keen for day two.

Freshwater carnival was also strongly attended by interstate competitors, giving the Sawtell competitors a good indication of their competitiveness and fitness levels at this point in the season. Maggie achieved a very strong 3rd in the swim race with Rhys coming home in 12th place.

Board heats saw Maggie and Rhys finish 1st and 2nd respectively, with both showing excellent form and determination. The board final was the highlight of the day for Rhys, paddling a textbook perfect race to take out 1st position. Maggie paddled strongly in 3rd to be caught by a party wave and finish the race in 7th place.

The iron events again drew the crowds in to watch the athletes put through their paces. Order was again swim then board, with both male and female races featuring many strong competitors. Rhys completed a solid swim leg and then improved his position significantly on board to finish 4th. Maggie swam in first followed by a battle in the board leg, to take out 2nd place after a run finish.

Both Rhys and Maggie are taking away a wealth of knowledge from their two consecutive days of racing, setting them up for a positive carnival approach leading into this week's Country Championships to be held at Kingscliff Beach.

As two of the senior members of Greg Russell's training group, both Rhys and Maggie have been setting an example for the younger competitors in both training attitude and competitive approach. They may be the younger members of the senior club, but they are certainly inspiration for our junior competitors.


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
