Gerard has done an outstanding job of leading the Juniors committee this past season. Message from Club Captain

The patrol season is rapidly coming to a close with most patrols only having to undertake 2 more before we pull the flags down for this season. The date of the last patrol is **Sunday 28 April** with the honour of being the last patrol going to Patrol 11. Despite the season coming to an end soon we are still getting very good numbers to the beach as the water is just beautiful at about 25–26 °C. The weekend of the club championships was absolutely magnificent and all competitors had a good time. Thanks to the stalwarts from the club who, yet again, set the carnival up, managed the carnival including water safety and did most of the pack-up. Their expertise and dedication is invaluable. It is disappointing that more members are not prepared to assist with the carnival workload.

The Armidale School (TAS) had the 3rd of their pre winter training sessions at Sawtell on Monday 18 March. Again we were blessed with near perfect conditions for the day with all participants having a really good training session. Thanks to all those who assisted with training and water safety on the day and the previous 2 sessions this year. The 21 TAS students will be back in November for a total of 7 days to complete their bronze training.



The Coffs Ocean Swims will be held on Sunday 7 April. Unfortunately many of our usual helpers will be away due to the Aussies and a few other events so we are really looking for new people to assist with the water safety and first aid effort. The more members we have the bigger the donation to the club and, importantly, the better safety service we provide to the swimmers. Please help if you

All surf clubs have an Emergency Call Out Team for out of hours incidents or to assist patrols in very serious incidents. Ours consists of 8 members, all IRB qualified, who live relatively close to the club and who are frequently available to respond to call outs. Our team was called out on Saturday 23 March at 5:00pm following a triple zero call to the police that a kite surfer was in trouble near the island. 6 of the 8 members of our call out team responded without delay and in no time had communications established, an IRB in the water, support on the beach and a lookout established on the headland. The kite surfer was assisted and a potential serious outcome avoided. Our ability to provide this surf safety service to the public in addition to our patrol obligations is just another one of the benefits of our organization. I would like to thank all the members of the Sawtell Call Out Team for their commitment and assistance to the Organization.

The IRB Crewpersons course which will commence on **Sunday 5 May at 07:00**. This course is open to all patrolling Bronze medallion holders. The IRB Crew course will be followed by the IRB Drivers Course which is open to IRB Crewpersons who are 17 years of age this year. I strongly recommend these courses to all eligible people. Not only are they a lot of fun but you will develop valuable skills which are essential to all patrols. Without IRBs we are not allowed to patrol the beach. The NSW State Championships were held 6-10 March at Swansea Belmont. Sheena McTackett our President was the only Masters competitor to compete this year. Sheena came away with a 4th place in the board race narrowly missing out on a medal, and 7th in the swim. Well done, Sheena!

We had 14 competitors from the U15's and U17's compete in the Open Championships. The conditions were a slight swell, windy on Friday and little to no wind Saturday and Sunday with the sun out and shining. I hear this was a little different to the juniors last weekend.

Day 1 resulted in our first medal of the weekend, with Cloe Nolan winning a Bronze medal in the U15 2km run! Fantastic achievement! Breah Fischer place 6th in this race as well – pretty good for a 13 year old! Hayley Fischer and Cloe placed 5th in their board rescue and they teamed up with Orla Carey in the board relay for a 14th place.

Day 2 was our best achievement for the weekend. Our U17 girls, Libby Waugh, Alyssa Golding, and Emily Meacham teamed up to win Gold in the U17 Ski Relay! What a race it was. Emily got us off to an amazing start, coming in 5th and tagging Libby whom made up 2 places in her leg to then tag Alyssa who finished off the last leg coming into the beach alongside Wanda with a sprint to the finish line to win Gold! It was such an exciting finish. Libby and Alyssa teamed up in the U19 Double Ski Race and came away with our 3rd medal for the weekend with a Bronze medal! Fabulous for a couple of 15 year olds. Emily and Kate Murray also placed 6th in this race. Our U15's mostly got through to semi-finals in their board races, which was disappointing, but the seaweed won on the day unfortunately. Hayley Fischer went to the sprint track to take away some of her disappointment and placed 6th in the final! Well done, Hayley.

Day 3 was individual finals day. Alyssa placed 7th in the U17 board race. Emily placed 14th in the Open Ski Race. We also had 3 x U17's in the Ski Final, with Libby placing 6th, Emily 8th, and Alyssa 15th! All that ski training had paid off!

To put things into perspective, it's not easy even making a final at State. To come away with these results, it's a lot of hard work, dedication, commitment, and compromise.

Nipper News


