AWARDS

Your Club salutes Greg Jensen, Jeff Holmes and Scott Rayson on their recent award of the National Medal.

This medal is awarded to any active member who has undertaken a minimum of 30 hours of patrol during a season for 15 years or seasons commencing from when they achieved their Bronze Medallion.

Whilst the Club tries to ensure all those entitled to awards do receive them, it is a time-consuming task and it is possible to unfortunately overlook some members.

Awards which members may be entitled to (other than the above-mentioned National Medal) include:

National Patrol Service Award – provided in recognition to members who have completed

all patrol service requirements. Sawtell uses as a basis for this award those who have completed 100% of their allocated patrols. Clubs do interpret this requirement in different ways but Sawtell is of the view that if you cannot undertake an allocated patrol but arrange for a patrol swap that is acceptable.

SLSA Long Service Award – based solely on membership of a club (clubs)

Assessing/Coaching/Officiating Service Certificates

Conditions for these awards are set out in the National Recognition Framework available in the Members Portal library.

Message from the Club Captain

The 2020 – 2021 patrol season has got off to a good start with all patrol's embracing the patrol COVID restrictions and I thank you for taking the extra duties and precautions within your stride. It is nice to be back on the beach patrolling and mixing with the Sawtell locals and visitors to the area. What has been particularly heart-warming is the wonderful culture that exists within our Club. There have been a number of occasions where some patrols have needed urgent assistance; the overwhelming response from patrolling members volunteering to help out other members to ensure patrols are operational is incredible. It doesn't go unnoticed. The Club thanks you.



Some stats from patrols so far – four rescues to date this patrolling season, 1 in the IRB and 3 by board. I have heard the younger members of Patrol 6 were instrumental in 2 rescues recently and had the maturity above their years, remaining calm and putting their training into practice, which resulted in successful rescues. Well done to those involved. You should feel very proud!

You may have noticed the use of a drone on the beach during patrolling hours, providing surveillance and an additional layer of protection for beach goers. SLS would like to continue to assist our Club building volunteer UAV (drone) Operator Capability. Their aim is to have at least 1 Operator or Pilot present for the summer school holiday period. To facilitate this, SLS will be organising a Club Operator Induction Program to train our future operators. If you are interested, please contact me via email to express your interest. I will pass your details onto the Administrators of this course. **You do not require a bronze medallion to be eligible to be an Operator.**

I would like to thank every patrol for using the Patrol Operations App either on the Club's Samsung Tablet or on their own phone. While the App still has its quirks and is not nearly as reliable as we would all expect its continued use is valuable to the Club and to SLS generally. The most common issue found to date is not ensuring the patrol members attendance and sign on and off times in the app are the same as those recorded in the Patrol Log books so give this more attention please. If anyone needs some guidance or help in how to use the app, please do not hesitate to reach out.

If members are needing a swap for their rostered patrol, in the SLS Members portal, there is the ability to self-manage this process. If you need a patrol swap:

Log onto the SLS Members Portal. Select "View Full Roster", scroll down and indicate which patrol you require a substitute for. Members should also regularly view the "Patrol" section of the Members portal to indicate which patrol they can substitute or do a voluntary patrol for. After logging onto SLS Members Portal, from the menu options - select "Patrols" > "Patrol Swap". Scroll down and select which patrol you are able to assist with.

The Members portal should be one of the preferred methods to find a substitute, other than contacting another member directly. Failing that, both Steve Rayson or myself will put a notification on Surfguard upon advice of your patrol unavailability.

Every year the club submits one order for wind and (somewhat) waterproof Patrol Jackets. These cost \$55 each which is payable by the member on delivery of the jacket. The sizes range from XS to 3XL. If anyone wants to purchase a patrol jacket please email me with your size. There will only be one order for this season, likely to be done early December.

And most importantly a gathering will be held to farewell current Patrol Captain and past Gear and Maintenance Officer Shannon Wilson at the Clubhouse on **29 November at 4pm**. Garry Murray will be pleased when it arrives as he ensures the plants, already purchased, remain alive. **Huge thanks to Victor Lindsay** who spent 3.5 hrs with his mini digger and bobcat to incorporate 30m³ of Biomass Compost and refused to take any payment from the club even just for fuel.

UPCOMING TRAINING

SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE / BRONZE

Induction/Information session

Sunday 29 November 11am – training room – Sawtell Surf Club

Cost: \$175.00 includes online manual, 2 yrs membership (if already a member, fee is taken off), patrol uniform, certificate/medallion.

If you are not a strong swimmer, recommend that you start adult swim squads either at Sawtell Swim Centre or Park Beach Rd Swim Centre.

Duration: Approx. 4-6 weeks (SRC)
 Approx. 10 - 12 weeks (Bronze)

COURSE AIM The aim of these courses is to provide participants with skills and knowledge related to surf awareness, aquatic rescue operations, communication systems and equipment and resuscitation, For Bronze candidates it also provides participants with skills and knowledge related to emergency care, spinal management, communication, teamwork and Surf Life Saving patrol operations It is recommended for SLS members who wish to:

- perform in the role of SLS water safety personnel
- take on a lifesaving cadetship and join a lifesaving patrol.

SURF LIFE SAVING ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To commence training for the Surf Rescue Certificate you must:

- be a financial member of an SLS club
- be at least 13 years of age on the final assessment date
- complete an unaided swim of 200 m in 5 minutes or less (goggles and masks permitted) in a swimming pool of not less than 25 m, or over a measured open water course which will be observed prior to you undertaking any water training or assessment activities.

Evidence of this must be provided to the assessor prior to commencement of the assessment for these units of competency/ this SLSA award.

To commence training for the Bronze Medallion you must:

- be a financial member of an SLS club
- be at least 15 years of age on the final assessment date
- complete an unaided swim of 400 m in 9 minutes or less (goggles

and masks permitted) in a swimming pool of not less than 25 m, or over a measured open water course which will be observed prior to you undertaking any water training or assessment activities.

Evidence of this must be provided to the assessor prior to commencement of the assessment for these units of competency/ this SLSA award.

ADVANCE RESUSCITATION TECHNIQUES CERTIFICATE (HLTAID007)

Cost: Free for patrolling members
 \$50 for non-patrolling members

Online training to be completed prior to attendance

To commence training for the SLSA Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate you must meet the following entry requirements:

- be at least 15 years of age on the date of final assessment
- be a financial member of an SLS club.



PROFICIENCY: Next proficiency is

- **Saturday 7 November – 8am start** – Must have completed online skills maintenance prior
- **Sunday 6 December – 8am start** – Must have completed online skills maintenance prior (same day as Minnie Waters carnival)

Before any member can successfully complete a proficiency for any award, you must have completed the online skills maintenance. No exceptions.

To access online skills, log onto your members portal account, navigate through to e-learning portal, select 'My Training' and start your skills – once you have successfully completed this, you will receive an email confirming this. The Armidale School (TAS) The annual Bronze Medallion training program for TAS will be completed this year in November. This year there will be 26 students in the program.
