# Message from the Club Captain

Another patrol year done and dusted! Thankfully the patrolling season was uninterrupted by any COVID outbreak and we could continue to patrol right to the end of Anzac Day. The storms and heavy rain towards the end of the patrolling season was the only dampener in terms of patrolling, which apart from that saw another successful patrolling season if judging by all usual metrics – no drownings or serious injuries, very few rescues and relatively few preventative actions. In addition, all patrol inspections undertaken by the Branch Director of Lifesaving were passed with flying colours. We met all of our obligations under the Lifesavings Service Agreement in regard to patrol times, member competencies and patrol equipment without exception throughout the entire season. As a surf lifesaving club, we really do undertake our role on the beach very competently and professionally.

The after-hours callout crew will continue to monitor and respond to any emergencies which occurs outside of any council patrol hours, and as required until patrols resume again.

With patrols now finished, it is now time to turn our attention to our winter training and to ensure members who are wanting to upgrade their skills and competencies during the winter months can do so in preparation of patrolling again next Spring. One of the greatest needs and compulsory qualifications required to enable patrols to operate is IRB competencies. Last Sunday 2May saw Day 1 of the IRB Crewpersons course commence. That course will run for approximately 6-7 weeks, and at the completion

THE COFFS OCEAN SWIMS An event that has been run annually for 24 years, provides an opportunity for all members of the community, and visitors to the community, to participate in a healthy activity in the safe waters of the iconic Coffs Harbour Jetty Beach area. This was the first year that Sawtell SLSC had taken on the management of the event after the false start in 2020 with Covid causing cancellation of the event. This year's event also looked to be in jeopardy due to the extreme weather event the previous week but fortunately by the day of the event conditions had improved such that the event was able to take place, and we welcomed a fine, sunny, blue sky day.

Whilst a total of 409 people participated in the event numbers were lower than expected, due to many regional areas, particularly those outside of Coffs, being cut off as a result of the extreme weather event, and many swim participants were unable to travel. In spite of these challenges, the day went very well, with all who participated, and/or were involved, deeming the event a tremendous success. The Club relied heavily on volunteers from local surf clubs and other organisations, and the turnout and efforts of all who helped make the event a success on the day is testament to the amazing community members we have here in the Coffs Harbour area. Gratitude also goes to local businesses such as Beachside Radiology, Mike Blewitt Coffs Coast, Kennards Hire, Quality Hotel City Centre, and Stocks and Hogan, who, as well as Coffs Harbour City Council, were also prepared to support this event.

With it being the Club's first year of organising the event, however, there were always going to be learnings, to take away and use in a positive way moving forwards, to improve and build on the event in future years.

The Club is indebted to Brooke Hanson, AOM, multiple Olympic and World Gold Medallist, who was our Ambassador for the event, and brought not only ambassadorial status, but an enthusiastic yet unassuming sense and example of what the event is about – bringing together families and members of the community in a fun and healthy way and to Mick McFarlane who took on the role of MC for the event.

Proceeds from the event allow us to invest back into organisations within our community, such as Surf Clubs, Sawtell Swimming Club, Daybreak Rotary, and Coffs Coast Marine Rescue. With experience gained and lessons learned the Club looks forward to continuing its involvement with this event. # Message from Board Coach

It has been a challenging 2 years for the junior and senior board squad members. 2018/2019 season ended in April 2019, after which we had a short break and started Sunday board training from late May, progressing to full training from August 2019.

The 2019/2020 season was cut short due to Covid 19 and ended with the State championships. We were able to continue training (with restrictions) for most of the off-season last year and have continued till mid-April this year. The senior (and some of the junior) board competitors have essentially trained nonstop for the past 2 years and deserve a break. (So does the coach!).

I am hugely impressed with the work ethic of the board squad. They trained up to six sessions per week in all weather and surf conditions. Three board, two Gym, and one ironman each week, on top of regular pool sessions. Each year the programme is adapted to the needs of the athletes. The major change this season was to add more surf swimming to the board sessions. I am pleased to say that all members improved in this area. Hard work and clear focus are required to achieve results and all competitors were successful at local carnivals. The standard at State and Australian Championships was very high this year and we will be aiming to achieve even better results next season, with more exposure to out of branch carnivals.

Congratulations to everyone involved in the surf sport programme at Sawtell. Committee support is essential for any of this to happen. Well done and thank you to parents and all helpers, especially coaches and officials.
